- Prison [cell](#), a [room](#) used to hold people in prisons.

- [Cell](#) (EDA), a term used in [an](#) electronic circuit design schematics
- [Cell](#) (microprocessor), a microprocessor architecture developed by Sony, Toshiba, and IBM
- [Cell](#), a unit in a database [table](#) or spreadsheet, formed by the intersection of a row and a column
- [Cell](#), in wireless local area networking standards (including Wi-Fi), a wireless connection within a limited area, referred to as a [cell](#) or Basic Service Set
- [Cell](#), a fixed-length data frame used in the Asynchronous Transfer Mode protocol
- Cellphone, a phone connected to a cellular network
- [Cell](#) (network), area of radio coverage in a cellular network
- Memory [cell](#) (computing), the basic unit of (volatile or non-volatile) computer memory
- Mathematics
- [Cell](#) (geometry), a three-dimensional element, part of a higher-dimensional [object](#)
- [Cell](#), [an](#) element of [an](#) abstract [cell](#) complex
- [Cell](#), a basic unit of a cellular automaton
- [Cell](#), [an](#) element of a CW complex
- [Cell](#), a [k-face](#) of a simplicial complex

- [Cell](#) (journal), a scientific journal
- Electrochemical [cell](#), a device used to convert chemical energy to electrical energy
- Fuel [cell](#), a device used to convert chemical energy from a fuel like hydrogen to [electricity](#)
- Galvanic [cell](#) or voltaic [cell](#), a particular kind of electrochemical [cell](#)
- Photodetector, or photo [cell](#), a sensor which detects [light](#)
- Solar [cell](#), a component of photovoltaic systems used to convert the energy of [light](#) into [electricity](#)
- Storm [cell](#), the smallest unit of a storm-producing system.

- Chamber of commerce, a form of business network
- Legislative chamber, a deliberative assembly within a legislature
- Debate chamber, a [room](#) for people to discuss and debate
- Other uses
- Chamber (firearms), part of a weapon
- Combustion chamber, part of [an](#) engine in which fuel is burned
- Environmental chamber, used in testing environmental conditions
- Execution chamber, where capital punishment is carried out
- Gas chamber, apparatus for killing humans or animals

 - Home (Apple), a bundled application within the Apple iOS
 - Facebook Home, user interface layer for Android smartphones developed by Facebook
 - Google Home, a line of smart speakers by Google
 - Home button, a user interface element of most web browsers
 - Home directory, a file directory on [an](#) operating system
 - Home key, a key on computer keyboards
 - Home page, a page on a website
 - Home row, the central row of keys on a keyboard, important in touch typing
 - Home signal, a railway signal
 - PlayStation Home, a gaming networking service.
- Organizations and institutions
 - HOME (Manchester), [an](#) arts venue in Manchester, England
 - Heterosexuals Organized for a Moral Environment, a U.S. anti-gay organization
 - HOME Investment Partnerships Program, a U.S. federal assistance program
 - Humanitarian Organization for Migration Economics, a social welfare organization in Singapore
 - Nursing home, a residence facility for people requiring constant care
 - Project H.O.M.E., a non-profit organization
 - Retirement home, a multi-residence facility for elderly people.
- Sports
 - Home (sports), the city or field where a team generally plays
 - Home plate or home base, the final base in baseball.
- Technology
 - Cave (company), a Japanese video game company
 - Cave automatic virtual environment, a projection-based immersive virtual reality system
 - CAVE-based authentication, used to secure some mobile phone systems
 - Cave, [an](#) alternate [name](#) for the text-based computer game Colossal Cave Adventure
- Architectural spaces and related, broader meanings
 - Hall (concept), for the development of the meaning of the word
 - Hall, a [name](#) for a large house
 - Great hall
 - Hall and parlor house
 - Hallway
 - Mead hall
- Enterprises
 - Retail store, a shop where merchandise is sold, usually products and usually on a retail basis, and where wares are often kept
 - App store, [an](#) online retail store where apps are sold, included in many mobile operating systems
 - Department store, a retail store offering a wide range of consumer goods
 - Warehouse club (or wholesale club), a no-frills retail store, usually selling a wide variety of merchandise, in which customers may buy large, wholesale quantities at low prices
 - Warehouse, a location where items are stored, e.g., a [ship](#)'s paint store, and sometimes sold, e.g., Costco Warehouse Club.
- Data store, a repository for persistently storing and managing collections of data
- Štore, a town and a municipality in eastern Slovenia

- Store, expendables released from **an** aircraft, **such** as aircraft ordnance or countermeasures
