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- Assignment of the basic units , From phonemes to graphemes
 - **Vocal or spoken phonemes** , spoken sounds , universal sounds , vocal species , indexing sounds , vocal units
 - **written grapheme** , written stroke , symbols , writing units , two dimensional forms , forms , indexing alphabets
- A writing system comprises a particular set of symbols, called a **script**, as well as the rules by which the **script** represents a particular **language**.
 - classified according to how symbols function according to these rules
 - letters largely correspond to phonemes as the smallest **sound** segments that can distinguish one word from another
 - use symbols called letters that correspond to spoken phonemes
 - ALPHABET , An **alphabet** is a standard set of letters written to represent particular sounds in a spoken **language**.
 - a writing system in which only consonants are represented, leaving the vowel sounds to **be** inferred by the reader.
 - ABJAD
 - use characters that correspond to consonant-vowel pairs
 - ABUGIDA
 - Syllabaries use symbols called syllabograms to represent syllables or moras. a syllabary assigns symbols to spoken syllables
 - SYLLABOGRAM
 - is a written character that represents a semantic component of a **language**, **such** as a word or morpheme.
 - LOGOGRAMS
- write or draw
 - write about
 - write on mountains or pillars
 - written by
 - **person**
 - instrument
 - written on
 - paper
 - film
- design
- Based on the source of the Letter and the target **script**
 - **script** sounds same but different forms
 - **script** sounds same and same forms
 - similar vocabulary is a **language** family
 - but different vocabulary
- Based on the reference of **script**
 - **script** sounds based on indirect realism
 - **script** sounds referring to **an ideogram**
 - Chinese characters or logograms
 - unintelligible **script** sounds
- Based on reference to a particular idea (**sound** acting like **an ideogram** itself)
 - Reference to **group** of alphabets (a particular word or concept)
